Opportunities during Lent

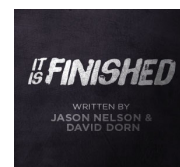
Lenten personal study and prayer guide

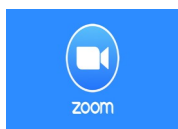
